Mission Statement • The mission of Beyond the Books Educational Foundation is to fund innovative enrichment programs for the students of McLean County Unit District No. 5 and Bloomington District 87 Public Schools.

How is the Foundation Structured? • Beyond The Books Educational Foundation is a not-for-profit 501(c)(3) Illinois corporation that was formed in 1992. Its purpose is to provide a long-term, self-sustaining financial base that will annually fund innovative academic programs in District 87 and Unit 5 public schools. All work of the Foundation is accomplished by private citizens who serve without salary as the Board of Directors. Annually, the Board elects officers and directors, reviews policies and practices, evaluates the funded projects and conducts a financial audit. The Boards of Education of Unit 5 and District 87 encouraged the formation of the Foundation and strongly support its efforts ... a partnership for innovation in public education.

What is the Process for Awarding Grants? • Each winter, educators in both District 87 and Unit 5 are invited to submit a written grant application which describes the project, method of implementation, cost estimate and the value of the program to students. Applications are reviewed by the Beyond the Books Educational Foundation Board of Directors and funding is awarded according to established criteria. The selected programs are implemented the following school year.

What Kinds of Enrichment Programs are Funded? • The objective of Beyond The Books Educational Foundation is to fund innovative programs (which are not currently offered) that enhance educational experiences. The Foundation is committed to educational excellence in the core academic areas, the arts and humanities, sciences, and technology. All age levels and areas of study are considered.

What is the Financial Goal of the Foundation? • Beyond The Books Educational Foundation is working toward growing its endowment fund to provide funding for all eligible grants. The ongoing financial commitment of contributors to the Foundation can enable our children and our community to become the best they can be.






Calendar Year 2022 Expense Summary for Annual Report



The grant funds will make it possible to create a dedicated outdoor classroom space for students that will tie into an existing project of "Nurturing Learning Through Nature". Special and general education students across multiple disciplines (technology, math, science, agriculture, horticulture, and wood/metals) will work collaboratively to create and implement the innovative outdoor learning environment. Real-life skills will be developed by the objectives provided to create the space such as: building the shed and garden bed(s), planting fruits, vegetables, and flowers; creating a natural pond and more.

Stevens is a first-year applicant to Beyond the Books and collaborated with the following educators to outline the goals and objectives of the submission: Liz Harris, Brock Keller, Hilary Ruyle, Molly Stolfa and Donald Whitman. With the collaboration between the educators and departments the goal is to create a space that can be used for up to 25 years with ongoing care and improvements that will continue to meet the needs of future students within each of the programs outlined.
